

## Communication & Language

- To recount stories and facts learnt using appropriate vocabulary
- To talk about stories and poems, beginning to create their own
- To speak in full sentences when appropriate
- To talk politely to other adults and peers in a conversation
- To independently engage in social phrases
- To use talk to explain their feelings and experiences, in clear sentences that others can understand

## Physical Development

## Literacy

- To apply set 1 and 2 phonics skills when reading and writing
- To read and write common exception words they have been taught
- To form letters correctly, on the line
- To use finger spaces between words
- To write a short phrase independently
- To re-read books to build confidence and fluency
- To create story maps to confidently re-tell stories

## Mathematics

- To subitise to 10
- To count to 20 and back
- To be able to say the parts of a whole number
- To make numbers to 10 in different ways using resources such as numicon and ten frames
- To add amounts using the count all method

## Personal, Social, Emotional Development

- To engage in discussions, listening and responding to the opinions of others
- To negotiate, collaborate and co-operate with others during play
- To acknowledge the achievements of their peers and be verbally supportive
