This week in Owls, we have been looking at different sentence types. We have worked punctuation on the that goes with these sentences, as well as learning how to express



spelling, organisation and memorising things tricky. How they may also be highly creative, and find it easier to work out how things work, make things and see patterns in

things. We recognised that we cannot tell if a person has dyslexia by the way they look, but that a person with dyslexia may find some lessons hard or frustrating. We therefore reflected on how important it is to be kind when anyone finds learning hard or upsetting.
