Maths Corner

This week, Hazel class have started to explore how to multiply fractions.

There are 3 simple steps to multiply fractions:



- 1. Multiply the top numbers (the numerators).
- 2. Multiply the bottom numbers (the denominators).
- 3. Simplify the fraction if needed.

To multiply a fraction by a whole number, you can write the whole number as a fraction with a denominator of 1. Then, you can multiply the numerators and multiply the denominators.



Here is a rhyme to help you remember what to do:
